The pass-fail grading option is intended to encourage undergraduate students that have achieved <u>sophomore status</u>, <u>are in good academic standing</u>, and have declared a <u>major</u> to take challenging courses <u>outside their major field</u> that might otherwise be avoided because of the fear of lowering his or her grade-point average. **Students may register for only one course per term with the optional Pass/Fail grading system, with a maximum of 6 courses in a college career. Courses numbered below 100 and over 400 are not permitted to be taken using the optional Pass/Fail grading system**. The student should be aware that there are some possible disadvantages of pass/fail grades, such as:

- Courses taken pass-fail may not be used in a student's major or minor program or used to fulfill
 distribution and general requirements in the colleges (see your advisor or associate dean for
 clarification since rules vary by college)
- To be eligible for the Dean's List in a specific semester, at least 12 hours of regularly graded (not pass-fail) courses must be carried in that semester
- Many readers of transcripts either ignore Pass/Fail graded courses or assume the lowest performance that would earn a pass grade
- Some graduate and professional schools may not accept pass-fail graded courses as satisfactory for advanced work in a particular field
- Pass/Fail courses do not satisfy the prerequisite for further study. Some courses over the 100 level are not eligible for the Pass/Fail grading option. Please consult the catalog for ineligible courses.
